## SUNDAY OF THE MYRRH BEARERS

### Who are the Myrrh-bearers???

Last week we heard in the Gospel of John about the risen Christ appearing to the disciples. The Gospel of John 20:19) tells us that when Christ appeared to his disciples they were hidden behind close doors. They were hidden because they feared the Jews, the same mob who just days earlier had cried out for Christ's Crucifixion. This week the Orthodox Church remembers the Myrrh-Bearing Women. While the Disciples were hiding in fear, the Myrrh-Bearing Women, in spite of the hostile environment around them, openly proclaimed their love for Christ by going to His tomb to anoint His Body.

The Scriptures tells us who some of these women were. So these are the one we know! First of all, we know that Mary, the Mother of God was among them; Mary Magdalene; Mary, the wife of Clopas; Joanna, the wife of Chouza; Salome, the mother of the sons of Zebedee; Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus; and Susanna. As for the rest, the scriptures are silent, but the fearless devotion of these women is truly an awe inspiring testament of faith.

There are many more Myrrh Bearing Women, in fact all of us can be just like them. But how do we act like these women? How do we become Myrrh-Bearers?

St. Paul tells us that Christ is the Head of the Church, and that Church is the Body of Christ. We must care for the Body of Christ, the Church, just like those Myrrh-Bearing Women who went to take care of Christ's Body. We must all become Myrrh-Bearers.

There are many ways for all of us to be Myrrh-Bearers for the Body of Christ. We can sing during the Divine Services of the Church. We can help with the cleaning of the Church, or the maintenance of the Church grounds. All of us can do this in both small and large ways, whether it's devoting a day to cleanup around the Church, or just pulling a few weeds, or picking up some trash. Every bit helps! We are Myrrh-Bearers when we take care of our Church—whether it be financially or through our time or talents. We are Myrrh-Bearers when we support the ministries of the Church—from supporting the Parish Youth, Ladies Society, and various Church functions and fundraisers. Anything and everything we do for the uplifting of Christ's Church on earth makes us act just like the Myrrh-Bearers.

Most importantly we are Myrrh-Bearers when we pray. We are Myrrh-bearers when we come into God's House in humility. We are Myrrh-Bearers when we follow Christ's command to love one another as he has loved us.
